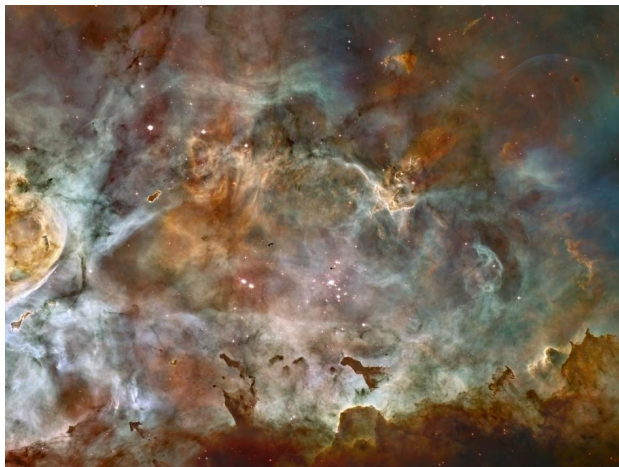
On the Mystery: Discerning God in Process

In this seminar, we will reflect together on several of the major questions of Christian theology: God and the scientific cosmos, truth in a pluralistic time, evil and divine omnipotence, the historical Jesus vis a vis the cosmic Christ, end things and new beginnings. We will consider them from both traditional and innovative points of view.

After studies in Heidelberg and in seminary, she did her doctoral work at Claremont Graduate University with John B. Cobb, Jr., and remains involved with the Center for Process Studies.
